Annie Mae McCants, 88, of Ravenel, widow of Beaufort “Mac” McCants died Tuesday, May 25, 2010 at Horizon Bay Assisted Living and Memory Care, Charleston. She retired as Assistant Manager of the C.E. Williams Middle School Cafeteria. She was an active member of Sauldam Baptist Church for many years where she served as Sunday School Teacher. A great lover of music, she served as music director of the church for several years, and sang as an alto and soloist and directed the production “Down By the Creek Bank”. She was past matron of Carolina Chapter #25 Order of the Eastern Star. She enjoyed writing and was the reporter for her Chapter for Palmetto Star News. A poet, she

published one book "Poems from the Heart". Member of the Charleston Milcah Temple #77 Daughters of the Nile where she sang with the Nile Choir. She enjoyed her role as a housewife and mother as well as "Granny" to her grandchildren. A friend to all, she enjoyed helping anyone who needed assistance.
