



## Antoinette "Net" Sanders

August 4, 1911 - March 2, 2010

Antoinette Griner Sanders, 98, entered into eternal rest on Tuesday, March 2, 2010 following a three year battle after suffering a stroke. She was born on Yonges Island on August 4, 1911 and was the daughter of John Franklin Griner and Marie Kulinski Griner.
