Clinton Douglas Ashley In loving tribute to Clint, who passed away in his home on December 13, 2015 at the age of 77.

He was born February 3, 1938 in Miami to Vernon J and Oceana Ashley. He moved his family to the Summerville area in 1972.

Clint is survived by his wife, Linda Spell Ashley; his 3 children Doug, Terry, and Edie with his first wife Phyllis Goodall; 8 grandchildren; 12 great grandchildren; 2 brothers, Jerry and Kim; and several nieces (thanks Diane) and nephews. Clint was a man of many talents and interests. He had the rare gift of perfect pitch so was able to play the trombone, guitar, piano, harmonica, and any other instrument he picked up. Rumor is he could tell if an engine was tuned properly by the sound. He also sang as baritone in several Barbershop Quartets. The "Dead Animal Zoo" in his home is testament to his hunting and fishing skills. He delighted guests with his recipes for cooking wild game dishes. He had a great sense of humor and was quick to laugh. He entertained with jokes, stories, trivia contests, and could not be beaten at playing hearts. He was an avid classic Ford fan and belonged to many local car clubs. His love of cars even involved drag car racing. In addition he was a very good artist. He was an amazing athlete-swimmer, trampolinist, scuba diver, spear fisherman, weight lifter, bicyclist and tennis player. He served his country and community as a Navy 1st Class Petty Officer on the 2nd nuclear powered sub, firefighter, real estate broker, residential builder, and chairman of the Dorchester Planning Board. He served 4 years as president of the

Coastal Cyclists, helped found the Palmetto Cycling Coalition, assisted in creation of “Share The Road” signs and placement, and volunteered on many committees to improve bicycle safety. Clint was a good man who will be missed.
