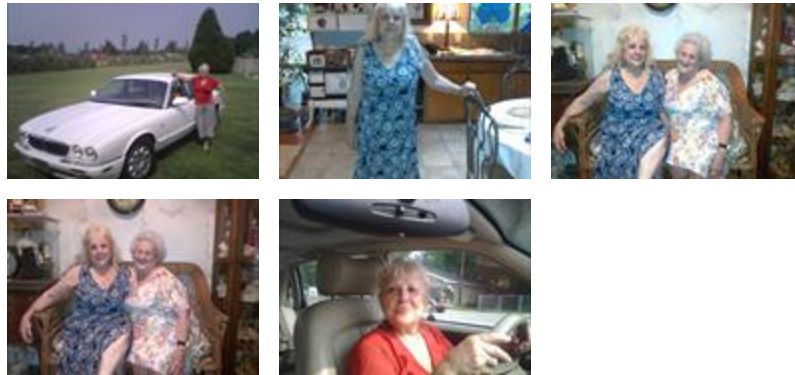

Thank you for always opening up your home to Aunt Hennie, I know she loved staying with you.

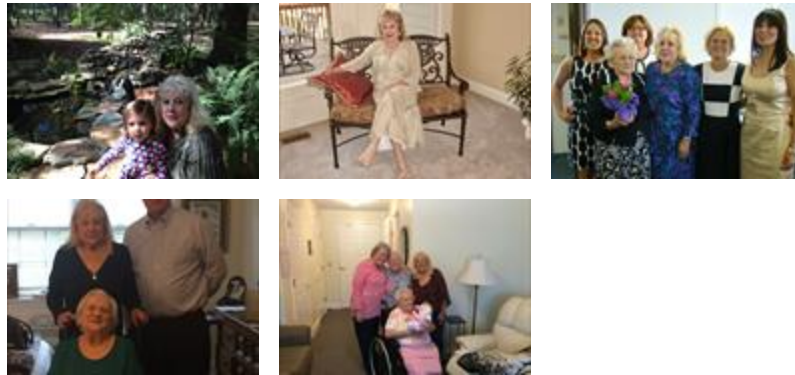

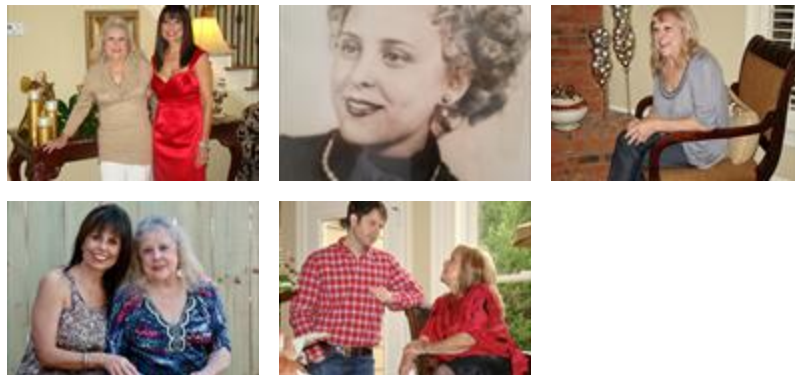

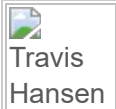
