So, David & I got that number 10 washtub, got it down to the edge of the Folly River - by this time, the tide was in, and all the rain had made it a formidable, raging body of water - so we climbed into the number 10, and we set sail into a ride from hell. The force of the water drug us to the middle of the river, and as stated, we knew no fear - and we were off! The caps on the water were splashing into the number 10, but did we care? No, we did not. To this day, I do not know when they realized we were missing from the house - what I do know is that David's daddy, Buddy, had to get in his boat, and come out there and rescue us. I truly don't believe that he and I had ever gotten a whipping to equal the one we got for that adventure! This is just one of my favorite memories of David, out of the millions I have and treasure.
