Dorothy “Dotty” K. Kinsman, 93, of Summerville, widow of Gordon Dudley Kinsman, passed away on Monday, August 4, 2014 at her residence. Dotty felt a call to work with the Nhambiquara Indians and God made this possible thru a miracle as she met Rev. Dudley Kinsman, already working with the Nhambiquara Indians. Dotty and Dudley tried to give the Gospel and serve the Lord wherever doors opened. She prayed that when she got to heaven, Christ would say “Well done, thou good and faithful servant.” Their story was recounted in THE FLUTE PLAYERS, by Mary Macomber.
