She was a former resident of Summerville, S.C. until 1979, and then moved to Felton, Ga. thru '82, then Palatka, Fl. thru '85, then returning to Felton, Ga. thru '96, where after the passing of her husband Rudy, she moved to Hardeeville, S.C. to live with her daughter (Phyllis) and son-in-law (Rick Lynes). This kept her close to her granddaughter (Tracy) and grandson (Willie) along with her great grandchildren which she spent lots of time with, while frequently commuting back and forth to Palatka Fl. In 2013, she moved to Palatka Fl. to be with her grandson (Malcolm) and enjoying time with her family and great grandchildren.

She retired as secretary for E.L. Long Motor Lines and Infinger. She was

proud of helping support her country and servicemen by working in the sheet metal shop at the Charleston Naval Shipyard during WWII. She was a lifelong Christian and knew God as her lord and savior. She was frequently known to ask others "Do you know God" and "If you die today, do you know where you will be" Her legacy is best described as a loving wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and supporting friend to all. She enjoyed life to its fullest while having good health and a large loving family who seen her as the family matriarch. Her later years were all dedicated to family. She spent time with each of the grandchildren for weeks or months at a time. She would surprise the grandchildren and great-grandchildren by picking them up at school for lunch breaks or birthday occasions. She was the family sitter while caring for all during sick days from school or vacation get-aways. She enjoyed making meals at each family's home she visited and was best known and praised for her home-made biscuits that everyone wanted her to make. She operated her automobile through the tender age of 87, and after that, made the train or family members her mode of transportation.

She was preceded in death by her first husband, James Otho Burger and her son from her second marriage, Ervin "Michael" Smith.
