



## CMSgt. G.L. Bryant

March 30, 1937 - June 3, 2026

CMSgt. G L Bryant of Camden, Delaware, passed away peacefully at home on Wednesday, June 3, 2026, surrounded by his loved ones. He was 89 years old.

Born on March 30, 1937, in Winchester, New Hampshire, he was the son of the late Gordon D. Bryant and Gladys G. Reed.

G L proudly dedicated 40 years of service to the United States Air Force, including 12 years on active duty and many years as an Air Reserve Technician with the Air Force Reserve. During his distinguished military career, he logged more than 20,000 flying hours, a testament to his skill, dedication, and unwavering commitment to service.

Beyond his military accomplishments, G L was deeply devoted to his community and personal interests. He had a lifelong passion for model railroading and played an instrumental role in organizing model railroad

activities throughout the region, including his involvement with First State Model Railroads.

His commitment to service extended far beyond his military career. G L was an active member and leader within the Moose Lodge, serving as Governor, Bingo Chairman, and Legion Activities Chairman. He also volunteered with the Camden-Wyoming Fire Auxiliary for 12 years and the Bowers Fire Auxiliary for 3 years. In addition, he was a proud member of Walter L. Fox Post #2 American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Camden.

Through his military service, volunteer work, and community involvement, G L touched countless lives and leaves behind a lasting legacy of leadership, generosity, and dedication.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his first wife, Patricia M. Bryant; his second wife, Rita E. Bryant; his daughter, Erica Walters; and his son, Timothy D. Bryant.

He is survived by his children, Gary D. Bryant (Angie) of Summerville, South Carolina; Michael R. Bryant of North Charleston, South Carolina; Robin E. Judy of Williamsburg, Kentucky; and Tina S. Potter (Chris) of Moncks Corner, South Carolina; his brother, Wesley Twombly of Enterprise, Oregon; 16 grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren; and many extended family members and friends who will cherish his memory.

A graveside service will take place at Dorchester Memory Gardens in

Summerville, South Carolina, on Friday, July 3, 2026 beginning at 11:00am.
