



Henry Lee Legare Jr.

January 19, 1951 - February 19, 2023

The world became a little less bright with the loss of beloved husband and father Henry "Hank" Lee Legare, Jr on February 19, 2023. Henry was born on January 19, 1951, in Charleston to Henry L. Sr. and Shirley Higgins Legare. His life will be celebrated on Tuesday, February 28, 2023, at a visitation at 2:00pm at Summerville Presbyterian Church (Lanneau Hall) 407 S. Laurel St., with a memorial service to follow at 3:30 in the church sanctuary. He was a 1969 graduate of North Charleston High School and a 1974 graduate of the University of South Carolina. He was a dedicated fan of all things Summerville Green Wave and Carolina Gamecocks. Win or lose he was a faithful fan, although he preferred winning. The win over Clemson this year 31-30 in the Palmetto Bowl was a highlight of his year.

Henry married Robin Riley on August 13, 1977, and they built their life in Summerville. He is survived by Robin, their son Matt Legare and his wife Ellen, and their daughter Caroline Dalrymple and her husband Andy. His five grandchildren, Lucy, Molly and Anna Lee Legare and Benjamin and Graham Dalrymple were the lights of his life. They all loved "G" as he loved them. He is also survived by his sisters Shirley Anne Landey (Max) and Nita McCord and their children. He is also survived by many cousins and great nephews and nieces. One of his favorite things was the family's week at Edisto every summer with his family and his sisters' families.

Henry worked for many years for Mass Mutual Insurance Co., and in his later years for Lincoln Financial. He loved all his clients, and they each became a cherished friend. Even after his latest illness he continued to serve them as he could.

He was a member of Northwood Church for several years. His family moved their membership to Summerville Presbyterian Church where he and Robin both have served in many capacities. He was a member of the Session as a ruling Elder. He had a servant's heart and served on committees where he could help people in need. He and Robin were vital members of the Seekers Sunday School class, and he was a long-time, faithful member of the men's Wednesday morning Bible study. Serving his community was an important part of his life, and he was on the advisory board of Trico Engineering Consultants, the Coach Mulkey Scholarship Fund, and the board of Dorchester County Community Outreach. He was also an active participant with Water Missions.

Henry was a true prayer warrior. If he knew you, and you had a need, then your name and your need were added to his prayer list. When he saw that a prayer had been answered, he highlighted it in yellow.

Helping in the lives of young people was very important to him throughout his life. He and Robin were youth leaders at Northwoods Church for several years. Henry grew up playing baseball at Park Circle, and he had many fond memories of the men who coached him. He paid his debt to these men by coaching youth softball, baseball and basketball. He made lasting impressions on the lives of the young people he coached.

Henry never met a stranger, and he was the best storyteller. We all missed his voice for the past two years, but we find comfort in knowing that his voice was still heard in our memories and his actions.
