



Marion Warner Blanton

October 29, 1937 - March 25, 2024

Marion Warner Blanton, a resident of N. Charleston, SC, passed away on Monday, March 25, 2024 at the age of 86. He was preceded in death by his wife of 49 years, Dorothy Lee Blanton, whom he met in Norfolk, Virginia, where he was stationed in 1968.

Born on October 29, 1937, in Mt Olive, SC, Marion Warner Blanton was a beloved son of the late Elbert Blanton and Thelma Leona Gause Blanton.

He is survived by his three children: Thomas Blanton, Teresa Compton (Duffee), and Debbie Burrows. His legacy extends to five grandchildren: Danelle Lever (Jason), Crystal Googe (Chris), Kristen Rodriguez (Robbie), Coleman Compton (Jenna), and Megan Powers (John). Additionally, he cherished his thirteen great-grandchildren: Brice, Mia, Lucas, Cannon, Cason, Levi, Caleb, Tripp, Charlee, Kylie, Weston, Eliana, and Everett. Marion Warner Blanton had two brothers: VT Blanton (Barbara) and Carl Blanton (Peggy), along with a sister, Brenda Shannon. Those who preceded him in death include his youngest sister, Deborah Kinney, his sister Zonnie Lee, her husband Lynwood Lee, and his brother-in-law, LD Shannon, and stepson John Markert.

Warner's life journey began when he joined the Navy in 1954, embarking on two decades of adventures across the globe. His service took him to Vietnam,

the Philippines, New Zealand, Thailand, Hawaii, Japan, China, and South Korea.

In 1971, the USS Orion brought him and his family to Charleston, SC, where he spent the remainder of his days. After retiring from the US Navy in June 1974, Warner continued his second career in civil service at the Charleston Naval Shipyard for another 20 years.

His commitment extended beyond work. Warner actively participated in the Masonic Lodge and the Shriners Temple. As a member of the Hillbilly Clan #82, he dedicated himself to visiting the burn unit at the Shriners Children's Hospital, exemplifying his passion for helping others. Whether rebuilding antique cars, mowing lawns, or fixing things, Warner was always ready to lend a helping hand. His memory will forever live on in the hearts of those he touched.
