Marion Jennings “Buck” Carter, 89, of Summerville, widower of Josephine O’Connor Carter, died Wednesday, March 30, 2011 at Trident Medical Center after a long illness. Funeral Mass will be held Thursday, April 7, 2011 at 9 o’clock at St. John the Beloved Catholic Church, Summerville.
