Marjorie Walker Pullen Pritchard died on August 5, 2025, in Summerville, South Carolina. She was born on July 17, 1932, in Manassas, Virginia, the daughter of the late J. Powers Pullen and Virginia Andrews Pullen.

She was predeceased by her husband, Dr. Claudius H. Pritchard, Jr. and her siblings, Virginia Palmer, Anne Hamilton Moore, and Thomas Pullen. seamstress, flower gardener, cook, and she had the gift of hospitality. During her husband's tenures as a college and university administrator, she entertained many students, professors, and alumni in her home. She was famous for her country ham biscuits.

Marjorie was active in garden clubs in Farmville, Virginia, St. Louis, Missouri, and Summerville, South Carolina. She was an elder in several Presbyterian churches as well as being active in the Women of the Church. She was a member of Summerville Presbyterian Church, where she also served as the Wedding Coordinator and Nursery Coordinator.
