Fiercely competitive, she was an outstanding athlete and remained a fanatical LSU fan to the core. A private family memorial service will take place on Saturday, December 12. 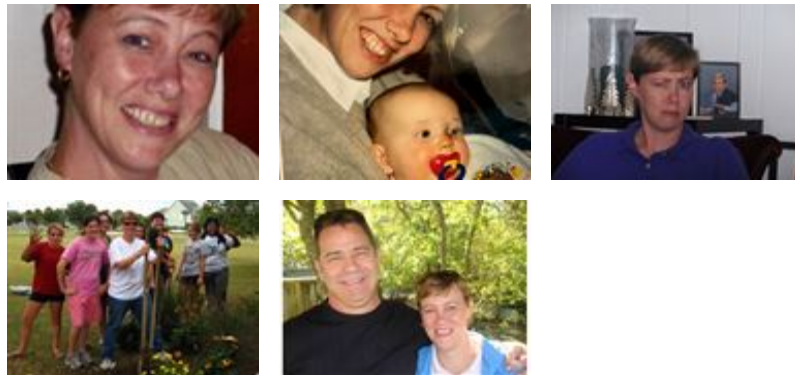
