On October 29, 2013, Dr. Richard B. Stice finished his battle with cancer and went home to the Lord. He lived his life for his three loves, his Lord, his family, and his patients.

A gathering of friends and family will be held on Friday, November 8, 2013 from 10 o'clock until hour of service at Riverbluff Church, 5421 River Bluff Parkway, North Charleston. Memorial Services will begin at 12 o'clock PM. Dr. Stice was born December 30, 1938, in Tulsa, Oklahoma to Elmer and Helen Stice. He has left behind his wife, Nancy, of 52 years; four children, Stuart Stice (Diane), Scott Stice (Jeanine), Stacy Guhl (Christian), and Shely Landrum (Adam); eleven grandchildren: Morgan and Matthew Stice; Shaun, Tyler, and Ellis Stice; Skylar and Leyton Guhl; Brian, Laura, Douglas, and Megan Landrum; a sister, Peggy Blaschke; sister-in-laws Sammye Disiere and Patty Harrison; four nieces; Kelly Donner, Kara Blaschke, Elizabeth Grady, and Jane Ann Scalf and one nephew, Craig Disiere. He immediately joined the Navy after medical school and remained a psychiatrist in the Navy until 1986. He was in private practice following his military career until his death. His patients became his extended family and always held a special place in his heart. He will be sorely missed by all who were blessed with his love and
