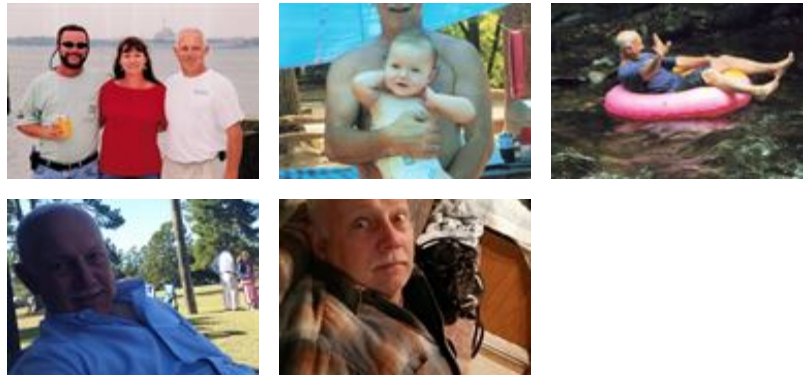

As I got older I didn't go over to "play" exactly but instead I would take flag folding lessons, listen to Gail as she began to learn the guitar, helped feed the horses, and fix a pot hole or two in his driveway. The story telling and life lessons still continued. I think that's what I enjoyed the most. My parents are just as amazing when it comes to life lessons and my up-bringing. My father even took after Bobby and joined the Sons Of Confederate Veterans. I wasn't the only one to learn a thing or two from Mr. Bobby. :) My mother and Gail were great friends too as I'm sure they have exchanged recipes, enjoyed meals together and have enjoyed many days worth of conversations.

I have many memories of being a teen and donating my weekends to cleaning up graves and planting flags with Bobby and my dad. Although we didn't attend near as many as he did. But we still shared that same passion and level of respect for our country and

our country's history. Matthew and I graduated high school together and of course Bobby and Gail were there for Matthew, but I remember hearing him shout as I walked across the stage too.

Life moved rather quickly when I graduated high school. I moved away from home, got married and had a child! Through the years of living next door to one another, we all quickly learned about each others families. We knew all about Bobby's siblings, and his mother in North Carolina. Bobby also took a liking to my grand parents when they would visit us in SC from W. Virginia. Bobby and My grandfather Evert were like two old reunited brothers. Both 30 years apart but best friends non the less. They both wore out the grass between our two houses! My grandfather would travel from WV with tools, engine parts, and plenty of other things of the sort to "tinker" with with Bobby. They both in their Liberty overalls, with greasy hands would end each visit with a great big hug and wet eyes. I loved seeing them be friends. They enjoyed the gospel together. They enjoyed the word of prayer. They each would source Bible scriptures for any of life's situations. My Grandfather passed a little over 2 years ago, but talked of good words about his friend Bobby until his last days.

The last time I saw Bobby was a very hard day for me and my family. It was the day of my mother's funeral. Bobby didn't enjoy a crowd so seeing him in attendance meant a lot to my family. I am sad to hear of Bobby's passing, but I can only image how happy he is to be back with old friends and family. Love you so much!

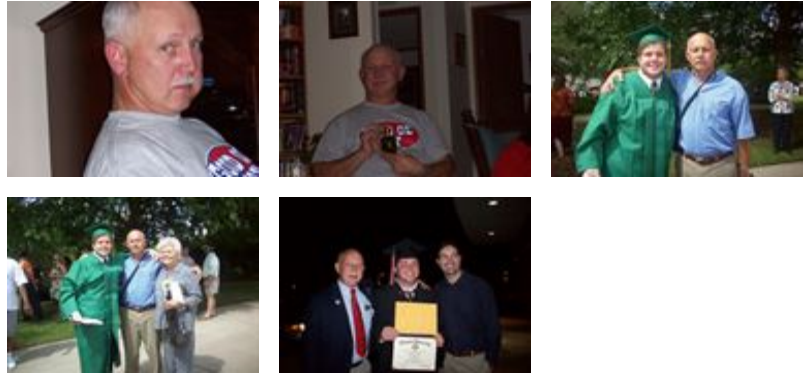

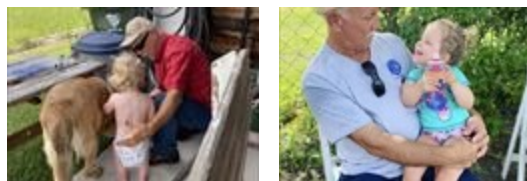
