



## Thomas William Wolter

February 2, 1943 - July 8, 2019

Thomas “Tom” William Wolter, age 76, of Summerville, South Carolina and loving husband of Patricia “Pat” Kulina Wolter, entered into eternal rest on Monday, July 8th 2019.

Tom was born on February 2nd, 1943 in St. Paul, Minnesota to the late Amadeus Frank and Genevieve Boise Wolter. He was the youngest of 6 children, three proceeded him in death, Marge Connelly, Elizabeth Paul and John Wolter.

Always by her side, Tom and Pat married on May 7th, 1966. For 53 years of marriage, a foundation built on a love for God and family were faithfully followed until he was called Home.

Tom loved being active in the church. He answered the calling to serve the Lord at the early age of 38. On May 16th, 1981, in Arlington, Virginia, he was ordained as a Deacon in the Catholic Church.
