My grandpa could talk haha. Anyone that knew him knew this but that is because he was naturally a teacher of many things. I used to think how did he instilled such a strong moral character in my father, as well as a strong work ethic and fearlessness in doing what is right no matter what. I see now he has done that in most everyone he met and surely in me. Today determination is my strongest attribute. I don't say that with pride but with gratitude that I learned that from him. That part of him will live in me everyday.

55 years my grandparents were married. They raised a family, and with that I mean more than their 4 children. The Mondo orphanage provided many of us with love and structure in a time of need. They had ups and downs. Downs they did not broadcast to the world nor did I pick up on them. Its beauty not because the other person was perfect but because they loved each others flaws too. They laughed at each other, they cared for each other, they respected each other. Vivid to this day I can see grandma's subtle glance to grandpa that captured a million words. They showed me what a good marriage looks like.

Grandpa evolved as a person in his years. I know he was a stern person in his early adulthood. As my grandpa he was too. His productive mind would settle from time to time and he'd enjoy us grandkids. He taught me 52 card pickup. I will never forget his laugh. Same laugh my father has. Memories of sitting in the living room with flashcards at night so I could catch up learning my times tables because I transferred schools and missed the lessons.

I grew up with stories of grandpa. As a military brat I traveled quite a bit. A lot of what I knew of him as a child was what people told me.

There was not a duty station we went to that someone did not recognize my last name and ask me what my connection was to Master Chief Mondo. All of them would crack a smile and share a memory of his moral character, tough love and determination. A story of how he made them a better person. I was proud to say that's my grandpa. I learned a lot of him in this way. As I grew up around military bases I soon heard those same stories shared about my father; his son. His legacy in the Navy lived on in dad.

Grandpa I love you dearly. Our relationship may have had gaps in living so far away but I will always hold you close to my heart and remember the lessons you taught me in life. I will also always remember you mowing the lawn endlessly, surprising Onnie (grandma) with a new big purchase of some sort, and murmuring little jokes about the boss lady; Onnie. :) I pray you rest in peace and in ease knowing we all gained immensely from knowing you. 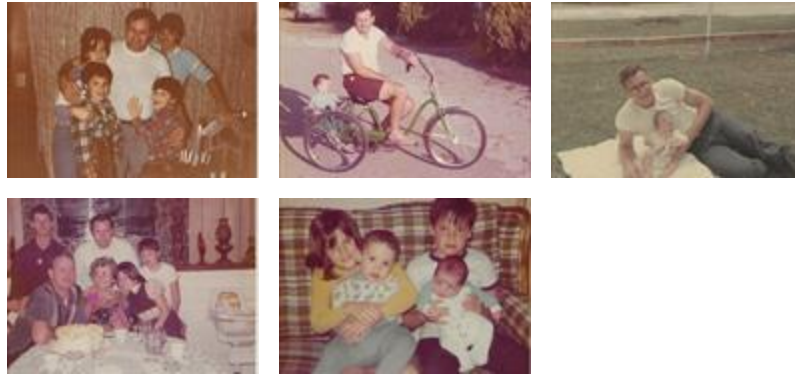
