Bill was born in Richmond, Virginia, and graduated from Varina High School where he received

the nickname "Fleecy" from his fellow football teammates.

A US Air Force veteran, he enlisted in the Air Force shortly after high school and also served

many years in the Virginia Air National Guard.

As a dedicated father he was actively involved in the lives of his children, grandchildren and

great-grandchildren. Their memories are endless of his fun sayings, songs and antics!

A successful businessman, Bill owned and operated Oakbrook Firestone where he greatly

impacted the community with his generous support of community fundraisers and helping

others with automotive needs. Bill was one of the few who quickly opened after Hurricane

Hugo to help people in the community with flat tires. Bill was an active member of the SC Tire

Dealers & Retreaders, holding the presidency for several years.

Bill was also an active member for 28 years of the Oakbrook & Summerville Kiwanis Clubs and

his passion was supporting the schools, teachers and students in the community by serving

with Terrific Kids! He was a twice recipient of the Kiwanis George F. Hixson Fellowship award.

An active member of Old Fort Baptist Church, he served as Deacon for many years and

endeared himself to many as a new member when he volunteered to put tires on the ministry

bus! His entire life was known as faithfully helping and serving others.

Because of his passion for education, he was a member of Charleston Southern University's

Board of Visitors for many years, and actively supported and encouraged students.

In his later years, he moved to Assisted Living at The Village in Summerville where he soon

became the Honorary Mayor of the community! He loved making and painting birdhouses and

they were sold with the funds going to the Chaplain Ministry to help people in need.

He was never afraid of investing in others and has made a difference in so many lives. Bill was

a "Friend to All"!

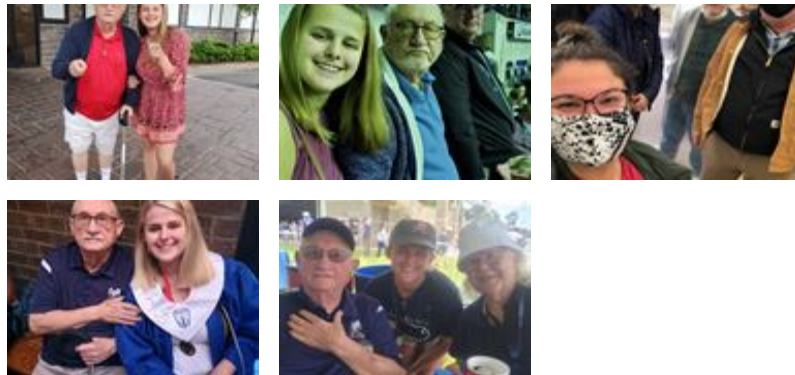
